RESIDENTIAL PEER PROGRAMS

Recovery Support Services
RSS provides shared community housing and a structured alcohol and other drug day program for people aged 16-25 years old wishing to live drug free. The program is based on peer support and offers participants a balance between structure and independence.

Oxford Houses
A peer support based program offering drug-free housing in the community for people over 18 years old. It provides residents with a peer managed environment that encourages independence, cooperation and mutual help.

US Women's Recovery Program
Provides safe, secure community housing and groups for women over 26 years old wishing to live drug and alcohol free and join a supportive community of like-minded people. This peer based program offers residents links to helpful health, welfare and community resources.

Recovery Care Coordination
Complex clinical care and non-clinical support for residents.



Family Drug Helpline 1300 660 068
A 24 hour confidential telephone service providing 24/7 support, information, strategies and referral to family members in need.


Family Counselling
Counselling service available to families and friends affected by someone's substance use.

Family Support Groups
Peer support groups providing opportunities to connect with others having similar experiences. With an educational component, these community based groups offer a supportive forum for members.

InFocus Education Program
A psychoeducational program developed for families and friends affected by someone's substance use. It offers practical support, relevant information, coping strategies and the opportunity for people to connect through shared experiences.

BreakThrough
Community education for families about Ice and other drugs. Developed and delivered in partnership with Turning Point and The Bouverie Centre.

FDH Projects
Family Gambling Help: developing peer support strategies for families affected by gambling.
Muslim Youth, Adult & Family Program (MYAF): in partnership with Odyssey House Victoria, Youth Substance Abuse Service (YSAS), Salvation Army and MyCenter.




Peer Workforce Development & Support
The sector lead in AOD peer workforce development. Driving workforce growth and sustainability, including facilitation of Victoria's AOD Peer Workforce Community of Practice.

SHARC Peer Worker Model
A framework for peer workforce development. Services include: Organisational Readiness Training, Peer Worker Training and Peer Worker Practice Supervision.

Peer Work in AOD
Consultation for AOD organisations around implementing, maintaining and supporting a peer workforce.

Peer Mentors in Justice
Recruiting, training and supervising Peer Mentors working in the justice system. Currently providing mentors to support parents engaged with the Family Drug Treatment Court.

Intentional Peer Support Australia
SHARC is the host of the Australian Hub of Intentional Peer Support (IPS). IPS is an alternative approach that enriches localised models of peer support.



Consumer Participation & Systemic Advocacy
APSU advocates for and supports people who have been personally impacted by addiction, to be involved in decision making around policy, service delivery, training and research. APSU delivers training in consumer participation to service users, family members and service providers.

LEAP Training
Lived Experience Applied – a training program tailored for people with a lived experience of addiction. Enables participants to use their lived experience as a form of expertise to support others.

Flipside Magazine
Written by consumers for consumers. Issued twice yearly covering relevant and current topics.

Speaker Bureau
Our network of trained speakers with lived experiences of addiction and other issues are available to share their experience in public forums.
